BOSQUE FARMS 4-H CLUB

The Board of the Bosque Farms Community Fair Takes pleasure in dedicating this book to the young people who are members of the Bosque Farms 4-H Club, their directors and project leaders.

Since the club consists of youngsters living on large farms as well as those from sprouting "ranches" developed on a smaller scale, there are 29 projects to fill the needs of the 182 registered members.

Sometimes when clubs attain the membership-size of the Bosque Farms group, they are split into several smaller clubs. However, this group is divided into junior and senior groups only for monthly meetings and other functions.

The history of the Bosque Farms club closely parallels that of the growth of this community. In 1936 Mrs. Chester Carpenter started the first 4-H project in her home with some 20 girls eager to learn sewing and cooking. The early 4-H work was under the sponsorship of the Bosque Farms Extension Club.

Through the years the success of this club has largely been due to the outstanding capabilities of its leaders. Those directing activities have been Mrs. William Gilcrease, Mrs. Alex Moore, Mr. and Mrs. Carl Curtis and Mr. and Mrs. D. E. Boggess. Directors for the past two years have been Mr. and Mrs. R. O. Stubbs. They have been ably assisted by many others who have spearheaded and chaperoned events, served as project leaders and in many other capacities.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The school gym will be open from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m., Friday, August 13, to receive all entries except livestock and poultry.
2. Judging of exhibits in the gym will begin at 1:30 p.m., August 13. Those exhibiting cut flowers may bring them in as late as 2:30 p.m. that same afternoon for judging.
3. Livestock and poultry must be on exhibit by 8 a.m., Saturday, August 14. Judging will begin promptly at 8:30 a.m., and take place in the arena.
4. All exhibits must remain in place until 4 p.m., Saturday, except cows and milk.
5. The Bosque Farms Community Fair Board or Rodeo Association assumes no responsibility for exhibits.
6. Only one entry per person in each class will be accepted, except where noted.
7. No entries, except livestock, will be accepted from previous years.
8. Single entries in a class will be judged on merit only.
9. All exhibits which are not listed will be considered display items only.
10. No one is allowed in the gym or arena while judging is in progress except judges and superintendents.
11. No one, except superintendents, is to be within 25 feet of the judges while they are judging livestock.
12. Decision of the judges is final.
13. Ribbons awarded for first, second and third-place winners in all departments and categories.
14. Persons exhibiting at the Fair will be:
 - a. All Bosque Farms boys and girls active in 4-H club work.
 - b. All participants in the Fair must be residents or property owners of the Bosque Farms community or residents permanently established in nearby communities.
 - c. Any merchant who makes a cash or merchandise donation to the Fair is invited to display.
