




Boundary Map

4-H Is For YOUth!

4-H in New Mexico had its roots in youth clubs which were started in the schools in 1911. These were called "Corn Clubs." Before long the projects offered were expanded and leadership was given through the New Mexico A&M College.

In 1914 the U.S. Congress officially established the Extension Service, and in 1917 "4-H" became the official name of youth groups sponsored by the Extension Service.

Todays program is for youth, ages 9-19, both rural and urban, and has expanded to 82 countries and 5 million members. The range of projects is enormous, from rocketry to entomology, and of course including all the traditional programs relating to farm animals and home economics.

4-H is a unique partnership involving youth leaders, state land-grant universities, federal-state-local governments and the private sector. The overall mission of the Cooperative Extension Service in conducting 4-H programs is to assist youth in acquiring knowledge, developing life skills and forming attitudes that will enable them to become self-directing. productive and contributing members of society.

Adult volunteers are essential to the successful delivery of 4-H programs to youth. Last year more than 600,000 volunteer leaders each donated 220 hours, drove 300-400 miles, and spent \$50-\$60 to prepare for and teach youth.

The estimated value of the total time devoted to 4-H and out-of-pocket expenses is about \$1 billion annually.

Bosque Farms hosts two 4-H Clubs, each with approximately 75 members and 16 leaders. The clubs reorganize each October and November, and if you have a skill to share or a child anxious for a worthwhile activity that's also fun, contact either Toma Shaver at 869-2297, the Drifters 4-H Club, or Steve Harrington, 869-9764 of the Bosque Farms 4-H Club.





Past, Present & Future

By Ken Rogers

Bosque Farms, New Mexico, a thriving community of almost 4,000 souls in 1984, had its beginning as a Works Project Administration (WPA) experiment in the midst of the Great Depression. In 1934, the U.S. Government bought 2,800 acres of swamp land, called the Bosque, just 18 miles South of Albuquerque. The following year, the experiment began. The swamp was drained, and a total of 72 New Mexico families were moved to the Bosque from Taos and Harding Counties. By the end of the first year, the number of settler families had dwindled to 42. Those remaining were provided Government-built homes on plots of land that averaged 50 acres. They did not own the property, but rented it with an option to buy at a later date. In addition to the homes, the government built a school for first through eighth grade students.

The school served many purposes in the early days of Bosque Farms. Its auditorium was used for nondenominational church meetings, community council meetings, and in 1939 was the site of the first annual Bosque Farms Fair.

That first fair was considered a huge success. Contributions to finance the community get together and picnic totaled a whopping \$14.11. In an effort to help pay the bills, a refreshment stand was employed. Profits from that endeavor were to go toward the payment of cash prizes for Fair exhibits and race events which included-among others-a Fat Ladies'

Race and a Skinny Ladies' Race.

As the successful entrants of the events collected their winnings, the prize funds evaporated. The resourceful Fair organizers would then call a halt to the activities for 10 minutes, allowing the winners to spend their prize money at the refreshment stand. With the coffers replenished, the games were on again. That procedure was enacted several times during the day, and after the last race was won and the last exhibit prize awarded, the First Bosque Farms Fair had netted a total profit of \$7.50 . . . a good start for financing the 1940 Fair.

During the ensuing 45 years, both the Bosque Farms community and the annual Fair grew and became proportionally better with each year. New events and exhibits were added annually.

For example, the 1983 Fair program began on August 11 with the briefing of superintendents and lasted through the morning of August 14 and the Fiddler's Contest. Prizes grew from the 5' to 50' variety in 1939 to the \$5-to\$75 range in 1983. Each succeeding year was bigger and better because of the planning innovations, the participation of the Village residents as well as many community organizations such as the Rodeo Association, the Bosque Farms 4-H Club, and the Village Library Fund. Nevertheless, many of the original attractions such as foot races, toad races, and the rolling pin throw have persisted since the beginning.

Who knows, by 1985 even the Fat Ladies' Race may be revived.
